1&2	Welcome - The meeting was called to order by Christopher Sears on Zoom. The Land Acknowledgement was read.	
3	Katy Whitfield and Ian da Silva, two local residents, presented "They Walked These Streets, We Will Remember Them". Katy and Ian gave a fantastic presentation highlighting the stories of numerous local veterans from WW1 and WW2 they have researched. They then responded to audience questions and comments.	
4	Welcome - the business part of the meeting was called to order by Christopher. Quorum of 10 members was verified. Seventeen members attended. Christopher began by thanking Michael Bohdanowicz for working on increasing the security for our WTJHS Zoom meetings.	
5	Minutes of Oct 6th General Meeting—Richard highlighted a few details: our last meeting was invaded by Zoom bombers and therefore this precipitated extra security measures for tonite's meeting. Discussion about investing funds directed to the Exec. More T-shirts will be ordered. Teya Zuzek is focused on improving the website. No edits were noted for the minutes. 8	Student Membership Category – Information regarding the proposal is posted on our website. We will be voting on this at our December 1 General meeting. The student membership will be \$10/year for Full time students with a valid student card. Voting rights will be included. The \$10 is the basic costs of the 3 yearly <i>Leader and Recorder</i> issues sent to the student. 9	Succession Planning – Both Christopher and Richard will be stepping down as President and VP in the spring. Hopefully new leadership will step up. Everyone on the executive has been taking on extra duties. The official duties are listed on the WTJHS website for each executive position. Please spread the word new leadership is needed. President duties are 10 hours/months. Hope thanked both Christopher and Richard.
